Identitas / January 2019 - May 2019

Chicago, Illinois, USA

Identitas is a project that I completed under the guidance of my graduate advisor, Zachary Pino. It uses technological objects that were fabricated and modelled to reflect human identities as metamorphosing traits that evolve and emerge as a result of contexts and interactions that we have with other people. The objects themselves were simple modules of electronic circuits that were programmed to have certain "character traits" (introversion, responsiveness, openness and so on) but could also adopt or change their traits depending on the frequency of contact they may have with a specific agent within the environment.

Centering our Values / August 2019 - December 2019

Chicago, Illinois, USA

The Centering Our Values: A guide to making dementia care decisions together project is part of a 16-week Communication Design Workshop at the Institute of Design/Illinois Institute of Technology during the Fall 2019 semester. The project resulted in the creation of a toolkit of exercises and resources that would support the decision making process of caregivers

of dementia patients, specifically pertaining to the African-American

cultural context. My own role was specifically pertaining to the creation of research guides, documenting interviews with various experts and caregivers of people experiencing dementia, coding research data and curating and managing content for the final toolkit, specifically pertaining to requisite grade levels for readability. This work was supported in part by the University of Chicago Bucksbaum Institute for Clinical Excellence and the SHARE Network. This project was accepted for presentation at the American Geriatrics Conference 2020 and will be published in the Journal of the American Geriatrics Society. It was also accepted for presentation at the Graphic Medicine Conference 2020. Both these conferences were cancelled as a result of the COVID-19 Pandemic.
